

What Should I Study in the **Sixth Form**?

1 When should I start to think about my subject choices?

It is never too early for you to start to think about what subjects you might wish to study in the Sixth Form at Moor Park. There are lots of subjects to choose from including some you might not have heard about and others that you may not have done at GCSE.

By now students in Y11 will have already given this some thought and provisionally selected subjects they are considering.

2 How can I make my mind up which subjects to take?

Here are a few simple 'tips' that might help:

Take your time over the choices and combinations of the subjects you want to do. Remember that on your application form you are only giving an indication of what you may wish to do. At Moor Park you will be able to change your mind at the last minute or add an extra-subject if you wish – we want the best for you and we want to help you choose the right subjects.

Take advice from your teachers, your parents, your older brothers and sisters and from students in the sixth form. However, remember that ultimately the choice must be yours.

3 To help you we have arranged a 'Sixth Form Forum' on Monday 23 March from 3.35pm until 5pm in the Sixth Form.

This will be an 'open house' occasion when sixth form students will be available to talk to you about any subject and answer any questions you may have about studying in the sixth form.

It's important to choose subjects you enjoy and research carefully any new subjects offered. You will be spending up to 5 hours per week for each subject in class and a further 5 hours per week working outside class – this is one reason why it is really important to take subjects you enjoy.

4 Finally research carefully whether the subjects you are choosing will enable you to go into the future career and/or the university course of your choice.

Selecting a combination of subjects that keep your options open is also worth considering as career choices often change.
